 - * The program would be opt-in, so if you wanted to just use your pcard that would still be available

Senator Reports

JaMaLAnd

- We're in the process of assessing whether a bulletin board can be placed into Main Hall's Laundry Room. At this juncture, we've spoken with Facilities Management (hereafter denoted as FM) and made preliminary measurements. Our FM Office has a business connection with Clairidge Business Products for bulletin boards and we've made initial contact with them. Our goal is to have a standard size (4' X 6') cork board with an aluminum border installed by the end of the semester for the benefit of fellow JaMaLanders.

- Upon repolling JaMaLanders on whether they've seen improvement with our Laundry Machines in Main Hall, 89% of respondents reported that they haven't seen change to the integrity of the machines. Upon learning this information, Senator Rev. Baker and I contacted FM regarding further improvements.
