Chinyere Ukabiala, Ombudsperson

Ukabiala came to present to the body, with her biggest goal to raise the awareness of the ombuds office as the first Ombudsperson of Grinnell College. The office was established to ensure that there was a confidential place for any member of campus to go. Part of her job is to work to solve conflict, and also find systemic problems on campus and work to fix them. Advocates for a fair and just process, not any particular party. Her role is neutral and independent, not being directly involved with any department on campus but meets with the President periodically to make him aware of any recent issues while maintaining confidentiality. Will be a confidential source that will not share someone's information unless the person specifically asks her to.
